

Media Arts 2016/17

With the generous support of the Circleville City School Foundation, the Media Arts program in the 2016/17 school year was able to: launch Tiger TV, produce "The Circle" yearbook, promote CHS events for various organizations through graphic design and work with local businesses.

The Media Arts program has four classes: Tiger TV (video broadcast/production), Tiger Graphic Arts (Digital Image Editing/Photography), Introduction to Media Arts 101 and Capstone.

The students in Tiger TV produced a weekly news/ entertainment show and made promotional videos for various organizations.

The Tiger Graphic Arts classes were in charge of creating and running the digital display scoreboard at Fall and Winter Sports events. Tiger Graphic Arts students also produced the 2017 yearbook.

Media Arts 101 students were able to learn entry level Photography and Videography skills to prepare them for those various projects in the program.

Capstone students were seniors that demonstrated mastery in media arts. They worked with local companies and CHS organizations to produce videos and graphics.

115 students at CHS took at least one media arts class. 25 students participated in Business Professionals of America, a career technology student organization. Those students competed at the regional level in various video, promotion and graphic events in front of real business professionals in the media career field.
